The Board reserves the right to reduce the time or limit the total time allowed for public comment. The Board may prohibit comment on individual agenda items, if the content of the comment is a topic that is not relevant to, or within the authority of the Board, or if the content of the comments is willfully disruptive of the meeting by being irrelevant, repetitious, slanderous, offensive, inflammatory, irrational or amounting to personal attacks or interfering with the rights of other speakers. Persons are invited to submit comments in writing on the agenda items and/or attend and make comments on that item at the Board meeting.
