Action and deliberation as defined in N.R.S. §241.015(2), may be taken on all items except where otherwise indicated. Items not scheduled for a specific time may be considered at any time and in any order. The Board may combine two or more agenda items for consideration. The Board may remove an item from the agenda or delay discussion relating to an item on the agenda at any time.

PUBLIC COMMENT: During the Board Meeting on August 22, 2018, comments by the general public may be taken at the beginning of the meeting and again before the adjournment of the meeting. Public comments will be for all matters, both on and off the agenda, and be limited to three minutes per person. The Board reserves the right to reduce the time allowed for public comment. The Board may prohibit comment on individual agenda items, if the content of the comment is a topic that is not relevant to, or within the authority of the Board, or if the content of the comments is willfully disruptive of the meeting by being irrelevant, repetitious, slanderous, offensive, inflammatory, irrational or amounting to personal attacks or interfering with the rights of other speakers. Persons are invited to submit comments in writing on the agenda items and/or attend and make comments on that item at the Board meeting.
