Project Scope

Pavement reconstruction and rehabilitation with safety, multimodal, drainage, and utility improvements

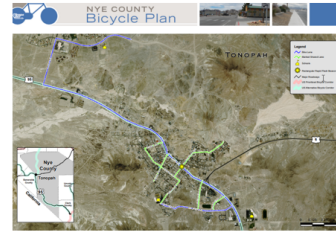
- Pavement rehabilitation with safety improvements
- Drainage and utility upgrades
- ADA sidewalk reconstruction and connectivity



Complete Streets Approach

Key Benefits

- Aligns with corridor safety goals
- Supports Nye County Bike Plan
- Allows decorative lighting and Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) crossings
- Enhances downtown revitalization vision
- Reduced lane configuration minimizes right-of-way impacts

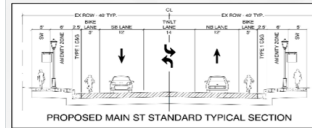


— Complete Streets Approach

Considerations

- Combines multiple improvements into one project
- Two-way left-turn lane (TWLTL) reduces crash exposure
- Achieves 20+ year pavement life cycle with periodic maintenance
- Removal of roughly 12 parking spots, 11% of existing

- enhance pedestrian safety and access downtown.
- Dedicated bike lanes and markings increase bicycle safety.



- Crosswalks are improved with yield lines and increased signage.

— Keep Existing 4-Lane Configuration

Project Scope

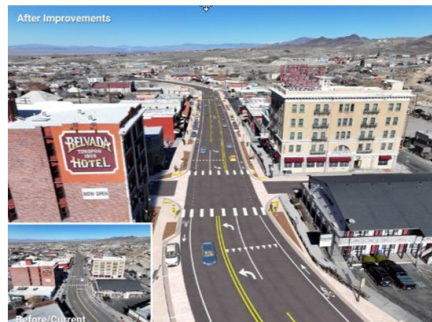
Betterment Only

- Updates to existing striping and signing
- Retains current 4-lane configuration
- Retains existing parking
- Reduced hydraulic improvements



— Summary Comparison

Complete Streets



- Safety-focused, multimodal, utility-inclusive
- Supports revitalization and long-term improvements

Keep 4-Lane Configuration



- Minimal improvements
- Maintains status quo but limits future opportunities

A **Complete Streets** concept is highly beneficial for a small, historic town like Tonopah, Nevada, because it shifts the focus of the main thoroughfare (U.S. Highway 6 / 95) from simply rushing traffic through the town to inviting people into the town. A Complete Streets design can transform downtown Tonopah into a safer, more vibrant, and economically resilient destination. Rather than treating our main thoroughfare strictly as a highway for vehicles passing through, a Complete Streets approach balances the needs of long-haul freight with the safety of pedestrians, the visibility of local businesses, and the preservation the town's historic identity.

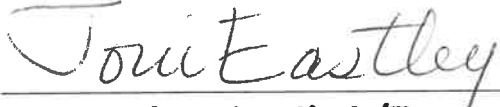
