4. Town Board Member's, Department Manager's, Nye County Commissioner's and Tonopah Main Street Comments.

Nye County Public Works Director Tim Dahl gave an update on the Tonopah sidewalk project. Currently it is out to bid. Also coming back in the next 6 months regarding RTC plan to allow Nye County to purchase 5 LED streetlights. He inquired of the Board where they would like the lights installed at intersections, not Main Street just County roads.

Patty Herzog of the Nevada GOED office and Tracy McCormick of Tonopah Main Street. Ms. Herzog wanted to let the Board know how great the program is doing in Tonopah in such a short time – very inspiring. Ideas instituted here are being shared with other communities. 10 Main Street programs in the State. Very thankful for the local support on this program.

5. Presentation for Salt Lake Express.
Kathy Pope with Salt Lake Express presented:
A day shuttle bus service between Reno and Las Vegas.
Would like to add 2 timetables a day. She left a bunch of brochures/schedules. The map shows all the other places they go. Trying to fill a gap between Reno and Elko. Looking for a lot of support from the communities. Started running on March 15, 2021 in this area. They had almost 500 passengers in the first 3 weeks. NDOT is subsidizing part of this program through a grant.




